"Migration, Domestic/Sexual Violence, and Other Risks for College Retention: A Comparison among Students in the Americas" (Planning). Linked to IDR Grant submitted in October 2012.
The team's research focuses on assessing and understanding barriers to retention for a 21st century demographic of current university students in the trans-Americas context at four universities in three countries: UTEP; Claustro University in Chihuahua, Mexico; The University of Costa Rica in San Jose, Costa Rica; and the Colegio de la Frontera Norte in Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. The unifying characteristic of these educational institutions is that a large percentage of the student population can be considered migrant or immigrant (e.g., students migrate to the city in which the university is located for a higher education or the university is located in a city with a large migrant population). Therefore, the study captures the effect of geographical displacement, whether forced or voluntary, and experiences of violence on college retention. Once consolidated under the present grant, the team will apply

for external funding for a study tentatively titled "Migration, Domestic/Sexual Violence and Other Risks for College Retention: A Comparison among Students in the Americas."
